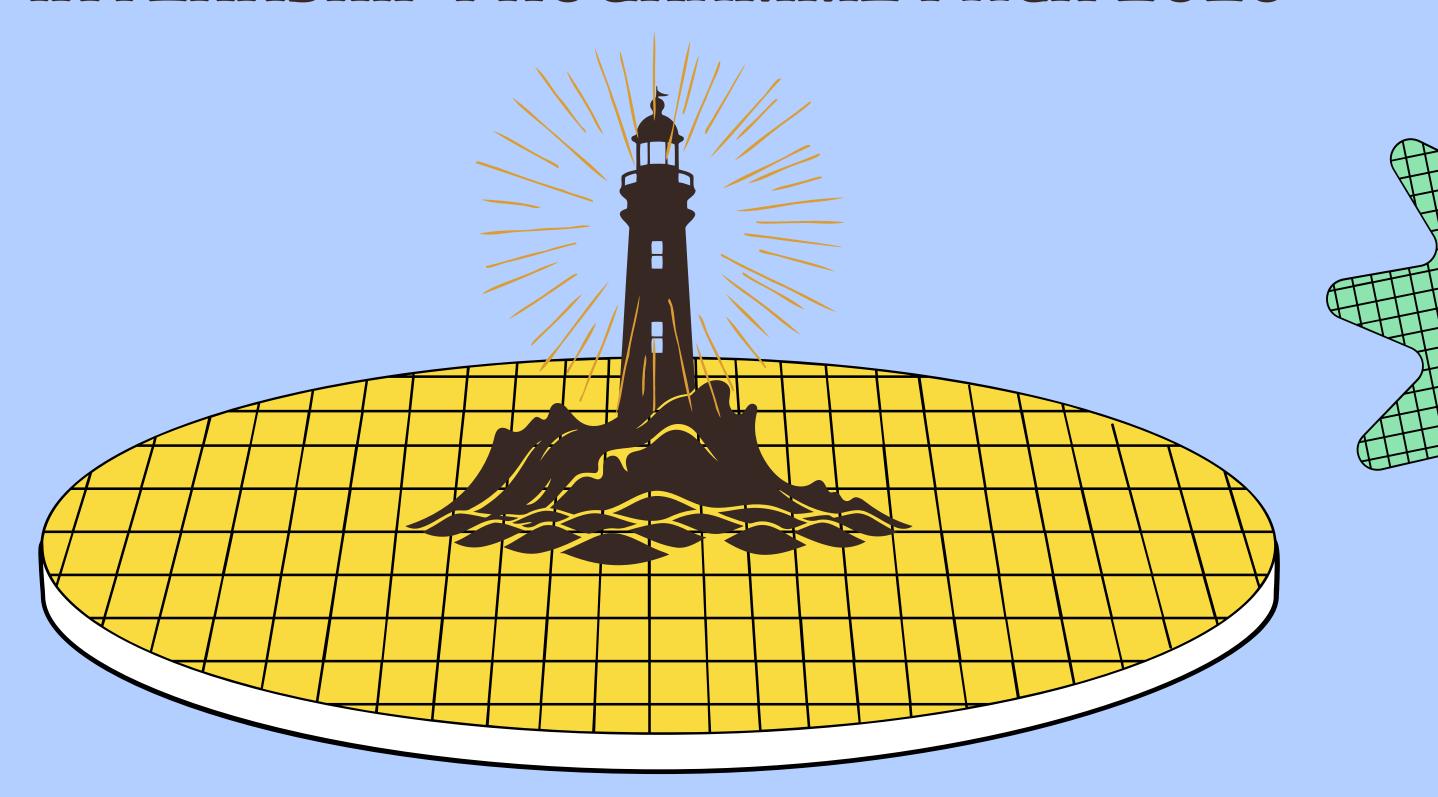

St Luke's Hospice Plymouth is set to transform the city with an extraordinary, large-scale art trail, illuminating our senses and igniting our imaginations.

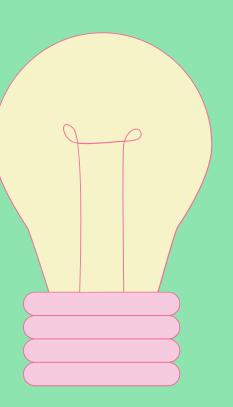
Following on from the popular Elmer's Big Parade in 2019, we are delighted to announce our next hugely exciting art trail, St Luke's Guiding Lights.

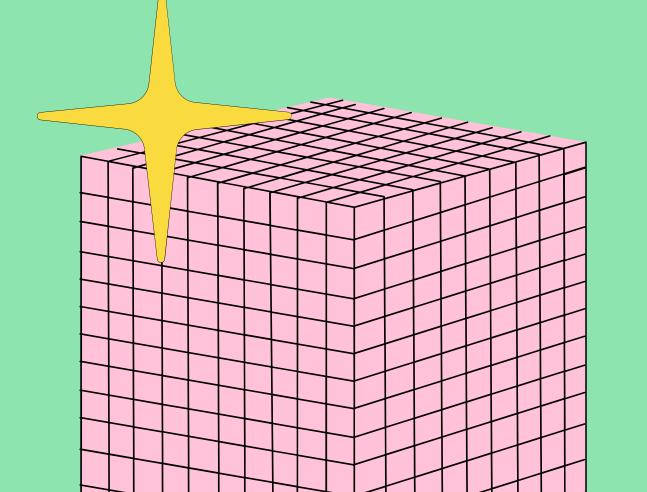
It will be a celebration of the culture, heritage and diversity of our wonderful city.

- Support project team with the art trail and events.



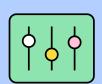














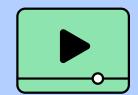


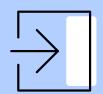




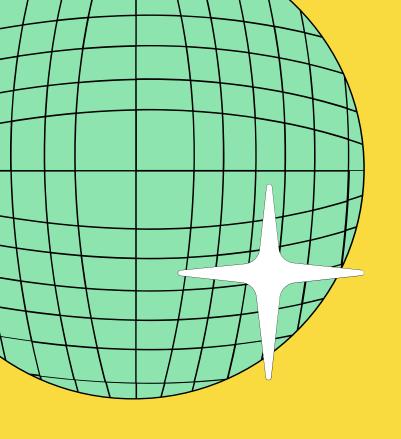










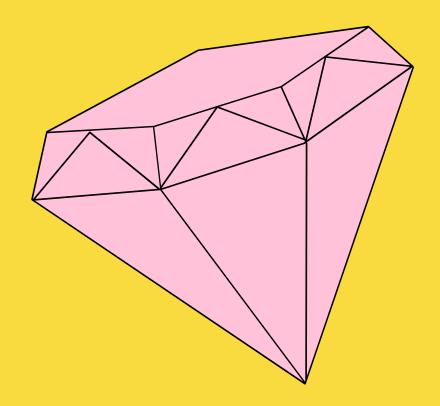


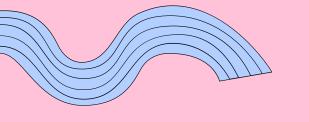

TERMS & CONDITIONS

1. Internship Period

The internship will run from January 2026 to October 2026. The monthly dates and hours are to be agreed in advance directly with the project mentor, with flexibility based on the intern's availability and the project team's needs.

2. Nature of Internship

This internship is educational and voluntary and is designed to offer hands-on experience with a public art installation and a community-based art trail. You will learn about community engagement, charity work and public art. It is not a contract of employment and does not guarantee future job placement.

3. Supervision and Mentorship

Intern will be supported by a designated mentor from the St Luke's hospice project team. Regular check-ins and feedback sessions will be provided.

4. Stipend and Expenses

This internship is unpaid.

The intern will be expected to cover the cost of their own meals. Travel arrangements can be discussed directly with the project mentor.

5. Attendance and Conduct

Interns must inform their mentor of any absences with as much notice as possible. Consistent lateness or absence without communication may result in termination of the internship.

6. Confidentiality

Interns must not disclose any confidential information or internal processes to external parties without prior consent. All personal information about staff must be treated as strictly confidential and must not be shared or discussed outside the placement.

7. Boundaries and Sensitivity

Interns will not be expected to work on the hospice ward but will receive guidance on how to engage in close proximity to a sensitive environment.

8. Insurance and Liability

Interns are covered under the hospice's volunteer insurance while on official duties. Personal possessions are the responsibility of the intern.

9. Termination

The hospice reserves the right to end the internship early due to misconduct, breach of confidentiality, inappropriate behaviour, or for safeguarding reasons.

CODE OF CONDUCT



1. Respect and Compassion

Interns are expected to behave in a respectful, responsible, and professional manner. Please treat everyone with kindness, dignity, and sensitivity.

2. Professionalism and Boundaries

Maintain professional relationships with all staff.

3. Communication

Maintain clear and respectful communication with your mentor and peers. Ask questions when uncertain and respond to feedback positively.

4. Confidentiality and Privacy

Never share personal stories, names, or artwork without permission. Do not take photos or record anything on-site unless explicitly allowed.

5. Creative Integrity

Respect the creative process of artists. All creative work should be properly credited. Plagiarism or misrepresentation of work is strictly prohibited.

6. Inclusivity

Harassment, discrimination, or disrespectful behaviour based on race, gender, religion, nationality, disability, or sexual orientation will not be tolerated. Be mindful of diversity and different life experiences. Avoid assumptions and treat all individuals with equal respect.

7. Dress Code

Dress modestly and comfortably. Avoid wearing clothing with offensive language or imagery.

8. Health and Safety

Follow all health and safety guidelines, especially when using materials or equipment.

9. Social Media and Public Representation

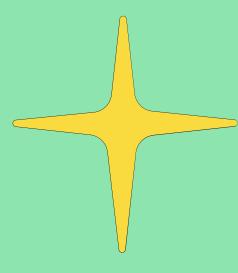
Do not post about your internship or the hospice environment on social media without prior approval.

10. Punctuality and Deadlines

Be on time for engagements and meet all deadlines unless prior arrangements have been made.

11. Use of Property

Interns must treat organisational equipment, materials, and spaces with care. Personal use of resources without permission is prohibited.
